BY THE NUMBERS

- The Watts and Florence-Firestone areas have a high population of people of color, with over 90% of residents identifying as Black or Latino.
- Over 50% of Florence-Firestone residents and over 70% of Watts residents live 200% below the Federal Poverty Level.
- South Central Heals and Watts Wellness have visited a combined 4,831 unique households with a total of 15,404 visits across the Florence-Firestone and Watts areas.
- South Central Heals and Watts Wellness have provided 817 referrals, connecting residents to essential services like healthcare, housing assistance, mental health support, and food resources.
