Lead Poisoning Prevention and Awareness Presentations

Parents/Guardians	Pregnant Teens or Teen Parents
Require a minimum of 20 Participants. This one-hour presentation will discuss how lead poisoning can affect children, the sources of lead poisoning, and steps parents can take to prevent lead poisoning. The presentation will also discuss screening for lead poisoning and locations parents can go for free and low cost health services for children. Classes are conducted in English or Spanish.	Require a minimum of 15 participants. This will be a one-hour, interactive presentation, which will discuss how lead is transferred to the fetus, how lead poisoning can affect children, the sources of lead poisoning and steps parents can take to prevent lead poisoning. Classes are conducted in English.
Professionals (i.e. Schools, Agencies Providing Services for Children or Teens, etc.)	Childcare Providers
Require a minimum of 15 participants. This presentation will require between thirty minutes to one hour. It will identify sources of childhood lead poisoning, methods to prevent lead poisoning and the tests that are needed to identify lead poisoning. It will also familiarize participants to the services provided by the Childhood Lead Poisoning Prevention Program. Classes are conducted in English.	Require a minimum of 15 participants. This two-hour presentation will promote the health and safety of children through childcare activities that are easy to implement. It will also provide community resources to child care centers to assist in prevention efforts. <i>The presentation satisfies two hours of the 15-hour Health and Safety training required for licensed day care facilities.</i> Classes are conducted in English or Spanish.
