# Percent of Total Live Births by Service Planning Area (SPA) Los Angeles County, 2006








Total number of live births in Los Angeles County, 2006 = 151,837


## Number of Very Low Birthweight (VLBW) Live Birth by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)




# Number of Preterm Live Births by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)


### Number of Early Preterm Live Births by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)


# Number of Moderate Preterm Live Birth by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)

### **Number of Infant Deaths** by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)









## Number of Neonatal Deaths by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)










# Number of Post-Neonatal Deaths by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)







by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)




## Percent of Live Births by Mothers Who Began Prenatal Care (PNC) in the First Trimester by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)






# Number of Live Births by Mothers Who Had Late Prenatal Care (PNC) by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)




# Percent of Live Births by Mothers Who Had Late Prenatal Care (PNC) by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)







Note: Currently, there is no standard definition of or reporting system for domestic violence. Domestic violence is a complex issue involving many social and psychological forces. Therefore, reliance on a single indicator does not present a complete picture of the problem. To begin addressing these barriers, it is important to identify the existing data sources and understand their advantages and limitations. Local police jurisdictions's mandated reporting on "domestic violence-related calls for assistance" is one data source commonly used to describe the frequency of domestic violence in California, because it is population-based and easily accessible. However, these data only illustrate local law enforcement practices and response to domestic violence calls and are not an adequate source for measuring either the prevalence or incidence of domestic violence injuries.















#### **KOTELCHUCK INDEX FOR PRENATAL CARE**

To classify a mother's prenatal care history, Kotelchuck first determines the "expected number of visits" based on the gestational age of the infant and the month care began:


