



## Percent of Total Live Births by Service Planning Area (SPA) Los Angeles County, 2007





## Percent of Total Live Births by Mother's Trimester Prenatal Care (PNC) Began Los Angeles County, 2007




#### Percent of Total Live Births by Adequacy of Prenatal Care Utilization Index Los Angeles County, 2007





#### Percent of Total Live Births by Parity and by Mother's Race/Ethnicity Los Angeles County, 2007





## Percent of Total Live Births by Gestational Age and by Service Planning Area (SPA) Los Angeles County, 2007







# Number of Preterm Live Births by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)





# Percent of Total Live Births by Birthweight and by Mother's Trimester Prenatal Care (PNC) Began Los Angeles County, 2007




## Number of Live Births by Mothers Who Had Late Prenatal Care (PNC) by Zip Code and Service Planning Area (SPA)




## Percent of Live Births by Mothers Who Had Late Prenatal Care (PNC) by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)

# Percent of Live Births to Mothers Less Than 20 Years of Age by Birthweight and by Mother's Age Los Angeles County, 2007







# Percent of Live Births to Mothers Less Than 20 Years of Age by Gestational Age and by Mother's Age Los Angeles County, 2007






# Number of Live Births by Mothers Less Than 18 years of Age by Zip Code\* and Service Planning Area (SPA)










