History of DWC

Founded in 1978, the Downtown Women's Center is the only organization in Los Angeles exclusively dedicated to addressing the needs of women overcoming poverty and homelessness in Skid Row.





Operational & Staffing Structure



Programs and Services Offered-2014 Impact

Housing

- 95% retained housing
- 119 units of on-site Permanent Supportive Housing
- 70 women housed outside of DWC on-site housing (including 26 Veterans)

Basic Needs

- 4000 received services
- 110,000 meals served



Health and Well-Being

- 300 women seen in 1000 Women's Health Medical Appointments
- 180 women seen in 1100 individual and group mental health sessions
- 830 women participated in Wellness Workshops

Opportunity

- 950 women participated in educational activities
- 44 placed into employment in 2014
- 90% retained employment


