1	. Call to Order & Introduction of Commissioners and Guests	Chair Tonya McKenzie, County of Los Angeles, the Commission on Alcohol and Other Drugs convened the meeting at 12:31 P.M. Chair Tonya McKenzie asked for self-introductions from all Commissioners and guests.
		Meeting held with no quorum/ no votes.
	Public Comments	 Public comment on behalf of other providers: There are concerns about the BHSA merger between Department of Public Health and Department of Mental Health. Concern that any drastic change of moving any services that are under prevention, harm reduction and treatment is detrimental because each of the services has its own process and to try to put that under Department of Mental Health is not a puzzle that fits all and it would disrupt decades of effective services. They urge that the services stay under Public Health and they will submit a letter to this effect. Merger could harm progress in integrating prevention, harm reduction and treatment due to DMH's lack of experience. Hard reduction saves lives, and the merger could push under served communities further from seeking services 'a call for advocacy and transparency in the process. Emphasis that harm reduction is not solely a mental health issue. The Commission acknowledged the concerns and confirmed the importance of continues advocacy and engagement.
