"...Because of administrative and logistic difficulties associated with the TST, IGRAs are attractive diagnostic aids for detecting M. tuberculosis infection. Unlike TSTs, IGRA results can be available within 24 hours without the need for a second visit. As laboratory-based assays, IGRAs are not subject to the biases and errors associated with TST placement and reading. However, errors in collecting, labeling, or transporting blood specimens, or while performing and interpreting these assays can decrease IGRA accuracy. Also, availability of IGRAs is limited by the need for a fresh blood sample and the potential for delays as a result of the long distances to laboratories that offer these tests.

The cost for an IGRA is substantially greater than that for a TST (109). However, this additional cost might be offset by decreases in the number of persons testing positive and the associated costs of evaluating and treating persons with positive test results (110). Use of an IGRA might increase acceptance of treatment for LTBI (111). However, cost-effectiveness studies are limited by the lack of critical data on the relative ability of these tests to predict subsequent disease..."


